



The Nautical William

Aylestone Lane Wigston Magna

The King William IV in Bell Street was demolished after the Second World War and the licence transferred to the new Nautical William in Aylestone Lane when the surrounding estate was built.

The Nautical William, clearly not an old building (probably late 1950s) but soon to be demolished to make way for a block of flats

William Cox owned land in Aylestone Lane, now the area around the Nautical William. In latter years Mr Wilford was Cox's tenant, and what names his fields had! - Lovedays, Franklins, Saltys, The Parlour, Little Meadow, Long Fields, Black Hut Fields, Ladkins, Footroad
